# GUIDELINES FOR COMPLETING AN ENTRY BLANK

The entry blank may be downloaded at [www.dvfair.com](http://www.dvfair.com)

1. We urge all to exhibit, but only exhibitors living in the following towns may enter for premiums: Dover, Halifax, Marlboro, Newfane, Readsboro, Searsburg, Somerset, Stamford, Stratton, Townshend, Wardsboro, Whitingham, & Wilmington. Livestock from herds outside member towns may compete for prizes.
2. Be sure to include all articles being considered for exhibit on your entry blank. Entries may be deleted at the last minute, but none may be added or exchanged.
3. Unless otherwise specified, only 2 items may be entered per lot.
4. No telephone entries will be accepted.
5. Include all necessary information on your entry blank:
  - a. Class Letter
  - b. Lot Number
  - c. Description of article
  - d. Anyone entering livestock need only inform the Supt. by August 15th with the number of animals being entered.
6. Give complete name, mailing address and town of residence (if different).
7. Mail completed **ADULT** entry blanks to: **DVFDA, PO Box 577, Wilmington, VT 05363 post marked by Friday, August 12, 2011 or deliver to People's United Bank in Wilmington. First Adult Entry received will be sent two Complementary Passes to the 2011 Farmers' Day Fair!**
8. Mail completed **YOUTH** entry blanks to: **DVFDA, PO Box 577, Wilmington, VT 05363 post marked by Friday, August 12, 2011 or deliver to People's United Bank in Wilmington.** Be sure age is included. Youth exhibitors must be 17 years of age or younger. **First Youth Entry received will be sent two Complementary Passes to the 2011 Farmers' Day Fair!**
9. **Coloring Contest:** Must be 17 years of age or younger. **Only Youths entering other exhibits** may enter Coloring Contest. The Coloring Contest picture is located next to the Entry Forms and must be filled out and attached to an Entry Form. **Winners of the contest shall receive a Complementary Bracelet for Thursday night's Bracelet Frenzy!**
10. **All exhibits must have been produced, made or grown by the exhibitor.** All entries in food (canned and vegetables) must be made or grown within

the past twelve (12) months. Containers may be opened for judging. No articles previously exhibited will be accepted. Livestock is excluded from this rule.

11. Exhibits may be entered in only one lot.
12. Exhibits that do not meet the required standards are ineligible for individual prizes.
13. Youth exhibits will be judged according to class and age group. Minimum age of youth exhibitors is 2 years of age.
14. All exhibits, except livestock, must be placed between 3:00 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. on Thursday, August 18, or 8:00 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. on Friday, August 19, 2011.
- 15. Youth & Adult exhibitors must pick up exhibits at 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 21, 2011.** Youth Premiums are paid on Sunday at 3:00 p.m. at the C.C. Haynes Building and Adult Premiums are paid at 3 p.m. at the Fair Office.
16. Any premium not picked up by 4:00 p.m. Sunday, August 21, and totaling \$10.00 or less will revert back to DVFDA. Other premium money will be mailed within one month.

Due precautions will be taken for the safety of all exhibits, but the Association will not be responsible for any loss or damage.

## **JUDGING**

**Judging will start at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, August 19. All buildings will be closed at this time and will open at 4:30 p.m. The Fair Association provides all judges.**

All exhibits must be made 100% by exhibitors or they will be disqualified.

All entries will be judged on quality and standards as determined by the judges.

Winning entries will be marked as follows:

1st	Blue Ribbon
2nd	Red Ribbon
3rd	White Ribbon

The awarding of prizes is entirely at the discretion of the judges and their decisions are final.

## **EXHIBITORS' RAFFLE**

All persons exhibiting at least one item (Classes A - S or Photo Contest) will be eligible for a special drawing and must sign up when picking up entry cards. Top prize for the adult drawing will be a \$100 certificate towards your bill from Scotts Clean Sweep. Other prizes will be awarded. Top prize for the youth drawing will be a \$50 Savings Bond. Other prizes will be awarded. Winners will be announced when premiums are picked up on Sunday.

## **MYRON ALLEN GARDENER OF THE YEAR AWARD**

This award is given to the adult exhibitor who receives the most blue ribbons in Class D, Class E (lots 2, 4, 6, 7, and 9), Class H, Class J and Class N (lots 1 - 34). Awarded at 4 p.m. at the Fair Pavilion on Saturday, August 20.

## **GREAT COOK AWARD**

This award is given to the adult exhibitor who has received the most blue ribbons in Class L and Class M. Awarded at 4 p.m. at the Fair Pavilion on Saturday, August 20.

# KING ARTHUR BAKING CONTEST



The Deerfield Valley Farmers’ Day fair is again hosting a King Arthur Flour Bake-Off Contest. Both ADULT and YOUTH entries will make and decorate 3 cupcakes using King Arthur Flour’s Golden Vanilla Cake and Easy Vanilla Frosting recipes (see below for recipes).

Entries will be judged on creativity (25 points), texture (25 points) and taste (50 points). Feel free to substitute flavorings, add dried fruit, nuts, flavored baking chips, etc. to your cupcakes and/or frosting—be inventive!! Be adventurous!! Have fun!!

There will be two age categories for youth entries: 8-12 years and 13-17 years. All entries will be judged separately from other prepared food entries. A first, second and third place winner will be named in each category of the contest. Prizes will be King Arthur products. **A King Arthur Flour UPC symbol MUST be attached to your entry.**

**Please, only one entry per person.** When entering the King Arthur Bake-Off Contest please list it on your entry form as: “KAF Bake-Off Contest” in Class L, Lot 24 (see page 24).

## RECIPES FOR BOTH ADULT AND YOUTH ENTRY

### GOLDEN VANILLA CAKE

- 2 cups sugar
- 3 ¼ cups **King Arthur Unbleached All-Purpose Flour**
- 2 ½ teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ¾ cup unsalted butter, soft
- 1 ¼ cups milk, at room temperature
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 4 large eggs

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Lightly grease and flour the wells of two muffin tins (24 muffin cups). You can also line the muffin tins with papers, and spray the insides of the papers.

In a large mixing bowl, whisk together the sugar, flour, baking powder and salt. Add the butter and beat with an electric mixer at low speed, until the mixture looks sandy. Combine the milk and vanilla; add all at once to the batter. Mix at low speed for 30 seconds, then increase the speed to medium and beat for 30 seconds.

Scrape the bottom and sides of the mixing bowl. With the mixer running at low speed, add 1 egg. Increase the speed to medium and beat for 30 seconds. Repeat this procedure with the second egg. Continue adding the eggs, scraping after each addition, until all 4 are added.

After the last egg is added, scrape the bowl once more, then beat at medium-high speed for 30 more seconds. Transfer the batter by heaping  $\frac{1}{4}$  cupfuls, into the prepared muffin tins. Check with toothpick for doneness, up to 23 to 25 minutes. Remove the cupcakes from the pans and let cool completely.

## EASY VANILLA FROSTING

6 tablespoons unsalted butter  
1/3 cup vegetable shortening  
1/8 teaspoon salt  
4 to 5 cups confectioner's sugar, sifted  
2 teaspoons vanilla extract  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  to  $\frac{1}{3}$  cup milk or cream

In a large bowl, beat together the butter, shortening and salt until fluffy. Add about half the confectioners' sugar, and beat slowly until well blended. Add the vanilla and half the milk or cream; beat until fluffy. Continue mixing in sugar and milk alternately, until they have been completely incorporated. Beat until the frosting is light and fluffy.

Yield: 2- $\frac{3}{4}$  cups

# HORSE SHOW

## Rules & Regulations:

- Show begins at 8:30 rain or shine
- No chaps in equitation classes
- Age based on January of current year
- Beginner- any age, up to 17 must be inexperienced at the canter. Walk/trot only
- Juniors-under age 14
- Seniors-14-17
- Adults- 18 and over
- Adult walk/trot - 18 and over walk trot only
- Lead line- Ages 3-11
- **No child will be tied or bound in any way to his/her horse. If he/she cannot hold on and ride independently he/she will be asked to leave the ring for his/her own safety**
- **All children age 17 and under must wear a helmet when showing**
- Green horse- horses in their 1st or 2nd year of showing, riders must be 13 or older
- Stallions must be shown by 18 and over
- Horses not shown in any class forfeit their entry fee, unless excused by a vet
- The judge's decision will be final
- All out-of-state horses must be accompanied by a current year negative coggins and rabies certificate
- All support members for rider will be required to pay general admission
- No galloping on grounds
- Proper show attire must be worn at all times
- All dogs must be on leashes
- There will be six ribbons awarded in each class
- Known kickers must wear a red ribbon in their tail
- If classes are cancelled due to weather fees will be returned for those classes only

# PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST

This contest is judged by itself and no premium money is paid to the exhibitors. If you are interested in receiving premiums, please see Class R, FINE ARTS.

**Please note that categories have changed from previous years.**

## Categories:

1. **Nature:** Showing plants, flowers and animals in their natural habitat.
2. **Pictorial,** including farm life, scenic, landscapes, farm/rural life, or farm scenes.
3. **Unusual:** This will be judged on rarity and uniqueness, not technical quality. (minimum photo size, this division only: 4" x 6")
4. **People and Pets of Vermont:** The Faces of Vermont, people or their animals.
5. **The Fair:** Pictures taken at last year's Farmers' Day Fair.
6. **My Town:** Illustrating people, activities, or scenery of the DVFDA member towns. This category includes sports activities.
7. **Cultivated Plant:** Indoor or outdoor plants, singly or in groups.

## Rules:

- \* This contest is open to residents of member towns (see guidelines at the beginning of this booklet). All photographs must have been taken in Vermont during the last five years and not previously exhibited at the Fair.
- \* No more than two entries per division will be judged.
- \* Black and white photographs will be judged within their appropriate class; they will not be judged separately.
- \* Photographs must be at least 5" x 7" and must be matted and/or framed. Framing will affect judging only if it greatly enhances or detracts from the photo.
- \* Photographs must be wired for hanging; if the photograph cannot be displayed on the presentation boards it may not be eligible for judging.
- \* Junior exhibitors may enter but will not be judged separately.
- \* Each entry must be clearly marked with the exhibitor's name and phone number.
- \* Cards for each entry must be filled out by the exhibitor when entries are delivered to the Fair. The card format will be provided. Entries without cards attached may not be judged.
- \* Prizes: Prizes for first and second place, and ribbons for first, second and third place will be awarded in each category. Best in Show will receive a cash prize.

**To enter:** Photos must be brought to Floral Hall on Thursday, August 18 between 3:00 and 8:00 pm or Friday, August 19 between 8:00 and 9:30 am. Please allow sufficient time to complete entry cards when bringing in your entries. Photos and prizes must be picked up between 3:00 and 4:00 pm on Sunday, August 21. All decisions of the judges are final.

## TRUCK PULL

All participating trucks must be street legal, registered, inspected, and insured. Registration at 3:30 p.m. on Thursday, August 18. The pull starts at 6:00 p.m. To pull, entrants must have a valid Motor Vehicle Operator's license. Those under 18 shall require parental/guardian authorization to pull. ## CLASS A CATTLE DEPARTMENT DAIRY AND BEEF

**ALL CATTLE MUST BE SUPERVISED AT ALL TIMES.** Adult and youth will show their animals at the same time. Animals must be shown in the ring to be judged. Exhibitors should bring their own watering pails. There shall not be more than two entries in any one class by the same owner. Cattle must come from herds known to be free from common contagious diseases. **Only disease-free cattle are permitted entry.**

# DEERFIELD VALLEY FARMERS' DAY

## Report of the 93rd Fair August 15, 19-22 & Sept. 18, 2010

From March 2011 Wilmington Town Report

What a Fair! The 93rd Annual Deerfield Valley Farmers' Day Fair was held August 15, 19th – 22nd, and Sept. 18, 2010. It was earlier, longer, better, and more fun!

This year the fair contracted with a different Vermont-owned amusement company. This allowed the Fair to be a week earlier, which to the Trustees' and school's delight, did not place the first day of school immediately following the last day of the Fair.

The Demolition Derby was held even earlier; during the closure of Old Home Week on August 15, which was just prior to the full Fair being set-up during the coming week. Despite the Derby being held a couple of weeks earlier than typical, the event and its following were comparable to the regularly scheduled event.

Family Night on Thurs, Aug. 19th, was welcomed with sunny skies, hot temperatures, and a mild crowd. Fair Patrons were enthusiastic with the number of rides, variety of rides, and the courtesy offered by the new midway. A DJ mixed tunes beneath the Main Tent while a new 4-Wheeler Pull provided entertainment on the other end of the grounds.

Friday was once again hot and sunny. The Country Jam session performed its debut under the Main Tent and was noted to be much more attended and participated than under the Cattle Shed, while the kids put on their helmets to compete in the Lawnmower Pull at the other end of the grounds. An educational Oxen Demonstration was introduced to replace the Oxen Pull, and was well received, appreciated, and attended.

Saturday was mostly overcast in the low 80s, and there was oh so much to see! Craft Demonstrations filled the gymnasium and spilled into the parking lot, a great horse show, saw competition, cattle judging, kids games, horse pulling competition, and a clown on the grounds were just some of the events adding to the pizzazz of this year's fair. As the day came to an end, Throttle livened up the evening under the Main Tent.

Sunday was met with pouring rain, and while the exhibit halls, craft show, and demonstrations remained open and well attended, the other events such as the Car Show and Truck Pull were greatly affected. The Truck Pull was rescheduled and held on a sunny Sept. 18, and over 500 people came to view it.

84 Wilmington residents entered over 600 exhibits and earned over \$1,300 in premiums! 52% of the exhibitors at the fair were from Wilmington and their exhibits made up 68% of the total number entered. This makes the Town of Wilmington the strongest exhibitor at the fair and also shows a great amount of pride in its work. The fair paid over \$2,057.75 in exhibitor premiums of which \$1,055.75 was paid to the kids! Let's see some more of that Wilmington pride at this year's fair!

The Fair Association is grateful to all participants and volunteers whose hard work contributes to the Fair's success. It takes thousands of hours and numerous

people to put on the Fair each year. A big thank you to the many businesses and individuals who donate prizes, materials, and equipment. We also thank the Wilmington Town Office, School District, Police, Fire, and Highway Departments who help out, as well as both Whitingham and Deerfield Valley Rescue. Thank you to the Town of Wilmington, which has contributed financially in providing police coverage.

We welcome your ideas and comments for events and improvements to the Fair and your volunteer time at the fair to setup, operate, and clean up after the fun is over. If you are interested, please contact any of the Fair Association trustees. Our regular monthly meetings are held at 7:00 PM on the 2nd Tuesday of the month at the Wilmington People's United Bank Branch.
