

- We urge all to exhibit, but only exhibitors living in the following towns may enter for premiums: Dover, Halifax, Marlboro, Newfane, Readsboro, Searsburg, Somerset, Stamford, Stratton, Townshend, Wardsboro, Whitingham, & Wilmington.
- Be sure to include all articles being considered for exhibit on your entry blank. Entries may be deleted at the last minute, but none may be added or exchanged.
- 3. Unless otherwise specified, only 2 items may be entered per lot.
- 4. No telephone entries will be accepted.
- 5. Include all necessary information on your entry blank:
 - Class Letter
 - b. Lot Number
 - c. Description of article
- Give complete name, mailing address and town of residence (if different).
- 7. Mail ALL completed entry blanks to: DVFDA, PO Box 577, Wilmington, VT 05363 post marked by Friday, August 2, 2019 or hand-deliver to People's United Bank in Wilmington by 4:30 pm, Friday, August 2, 2019.
- 8. All exhibits must have been produced, made or grown by the exhibitor. All entries in food (canned and vegetables) must be made or grown within the past twelve (12) months. Containers may be opened for judging. No articles previously exhibited will be accepted. Livestock is excluded from this rule.
- 9.. Exhibits may be entered in only one lot.
- 10. Exhibits that do not meet the required standards are ineligible for individual prizes.
- 11. Youth exhibits will be judged according to class and age group. Minimum age of youth exhibitors is 2 years of age.
- 12. All exhibits, except the Photography Contest, must be placed between 3:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, August 8, or 8:00 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. on Friday, August 9, 2019.
- 13. See Photography Contest (p. 18) for information about how to enter and when entries must be placed.

- 14. All Youth & Adult exhibits must be picked up between 3:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 11, 2019. Premiums are paid on Sunday from 3:00-4:00 pm: Youth Premiums are paid at the C.C. Haynes Building and Adult Premiums are paid at the Fair Office.
- 15. Any premium **not** picked up by 4:00 p.m. Sunday, August 11, and totaling \$10.00 or less will revert back to DVFDA. Other premium money will be mailed within one month.

Due precautions will be taken for the safety of all exhibits, but the Association will not be responsible for any loss or damage.

JUDGING

Judging will start at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, August 9. All buildings will be closed at this time and will open at 4:30 p.m. The Fair Association provides all judges.

All exhibits must be made 100% by exhibitors or they will be disqualified. All entries will be judged on quality and standards as determined by the judges.

Winning entries will be marked as follows:

1st Blue Ribbon 2nd Red Ribbon 3rd White Ribbon

The awarding of prizes is entirely at the discretion of the judges and their decisions are final.

Entries will be judged on appearance, moisture/texture and taste.

All entries will be judged separately from other prepared food entries. A first, second and third place winner will be named. A King Arthur Flour UPC symbol MUST be attached to your entry (note: original or a photocopy will be accepted), along with the adapted recipe.

APPLE CINNAMON CUPCAKES WITH CIDER FROSTING CUPCAKES

- 3 tablespoons unsalted butter, softened
- 3 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 2/3 cup sugar

- 2 tablespoons King Arthur Cake Enhancer, optional for a moister cupcake
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 1/4 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 3 tablespoons boiled cider
- 2 large eggs
- 1 1/2 cups King Arthur Unbleached Cake Flour
- 1/2 cup milk, at room temperature
- 1/2 cup apple-cinnamon jammy bits, optional
- *see tip below

FROSTING

- 6 tablespoons unsalted butter, softened
- 1 tablespoon meringue powder, optional; for holding power
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 3 tablespoons boiled cider
- 3 cups confectioners' sugar
- 1 tablespoon milk, optional

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. To make the cupcakes: Preheat the oven to 375°F, and position a rack in the center of the oven. Line a 12-cup muffin pan with papers and spray the insides, or lightly grease the pan.
- 2. In a medium bowl, beat the butter, vegetable oil, and sugar together until the mixture lightens in color and texture, 60 to 90 seconds.
- Beat in the cake enhancer, salt, baking powder, baking soda, spices, and boiled cider.
- 4. Beat in the eggs one at a time, scraping the bottom and sides of the bowl after each addition.
- 5. Weigh the flour, or measure it by gently spooning it into a measuring cup and sweeping off the excess. Gently mix in the flour, alternating it with the milk.
- 6. Fold in the jammy bits.
- 7. Spoon the batter into the prepared muffin pan a scone & muffin scoop works well here.
- 8. Bake the cupcakes for 17 to 20 minutes, until they're very light brown and a cake tester inserted into the center of one comes out clean.
- 9. Remove the cupcakes from the oven and after 5 minutes, transfer them to a rack to cool completely.
- 10. To make the frosting: Beat together the butter, meringue powder, salt, and boiled cider until fully combined.
- 11. Gradually add the sugar, beating until the frosting is light and fluffy. Add the milk, if necessary, to make the frosting nicely spreadable.
- 12. Spread or pipe the frosting onto the cooled cupcakes.
- 13. Store unfrosted cupcakes in an airtight container at room temperature for up to 2 days, or in the freezer for up to 1 month. Store frosted cupcakes, covered, in the refrigerator for up to 2 days.

TRUCK PULL

FRIDAY, AUGUST 9, 2019 AT 5:00 PM

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. All participants must be 16 years of age or older. Participants under 16 must have a valid driver's license and parent or guardian's signature on release form.
- 2. Vehicle may enter a class only one time
- Drivers must be in complete control of their vehicle at all times. NO HOT-RODDING leaving track or in pit area. Violators may be disqualified
- 4. All vehicles must be in park or neutral while being hooked to the sled
- 5. Seatbelts are recommended
- 6. Number one puller is test puller....

That person may or may not take first pull (must be decided while hooked to sled) if first pull is not taken second pull must happen immediately


- 7. Each vehicle must come to the start line with a draw bar with a minimum opening of at least 3 1/2" (inches) (clevis permitted). **ALL HITCHES MUST BE SOLID** Hitch height maximum of 26" (inches) high.
- 8. Only a mechanical failure will allow anyone to go to the back of the line.
- 9. Any and all weights must be secured. If items fall off the truck while pulling you **WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.**
- Any unsportsmanlike conduct will be an immediate disqualification of truck and driver
- 11. NO ALCOHOL OR DRUGS PERMITTED, PERIOD!!!!!! IF ANYONE IS SEEN CAUGHT OR UNDER THE SUSPECTED OF DRUGS OR ALCOHOL YOU WILL BE REPORTED TO POLICE, DISQUALIFIED AND REMOVED FROM FAIRGROUNDS
- 12. Any vehicle that leaves the course or boundary line while pulling will be disqualified.
- 13. No tire size restrictions---Must be street legal, D.O.T. approved (no tractor tires)
- 14. No solid rear suspensions---- must have travel. Stiff suspension O.K. (minimum 2" (inch) play in suspension.

- 15. Rear end lockers O.K front lockers street enhanced 6300# class only
- NO NITROUS OXIDE, PROPANE, BLOWERS OR SUPER CHARGERS
- 17. Trucks in street stock class must have stock motor and will be inspected. Computer chips, dual exhaust lift kits are O.K. No headers
 - 18. Open headers O.K. in street enhanced class only
 - 19. 4 tires only, in all classes 10,000# open class 6 tires ok
 - 20. Front weight bars cannot exceed 62" from front hubs
 - 21. NO PASSENGERS
 - 22. All trucks must have working brake system
 - 23. JUDGES DECISIONS ARE FINAL!

The Myrtle Phelps Perpetual Good Sportsmanship Award is given in memory of Myrtle Phelps, a lifelong resident of the Deerfield Valley and strong supporter of the Deerfield Valley Farmers' Day Fair, particularly the Youth division. The award is presented to the judge's choice for best sportsmanship in the English Youth and Western Youth divisions.

RULES & REGULATIONS:

- Show begins at 8:30 rain or shine.
- CLEAN SITE DEPOSIT per trailer not per entry. We share the field with other fair activities. We need your help in cleaning ALL manure and hay from the field/show area. When you are ready, one of the Horse show staff will check your site and return your deposit when the site is clean. Thank you in advance for your cooperation in helping keep the grounds clean!
- All persons 18 and under must wear a helmet when mounted. We encourage ALL riders to wear a helmet no matter the seat being ridden.
- No chaps in equitation classes.
- Age based on January of current year.
- 18 under SHOW FREE. Please pre-enter.
- Youth Walk Trot 13 and under, Walk Trot Only.
- Beginner 13 and under, Learning to Canter, Walk Trot Canter.
- Youth 18 and under, Walk Trot Canter.
- Adult 19 to 49 Walk Trot Canter.
- SR Select 50 and over.
- Adult Walk Trot 19 and over Walk Trot.
- Green Horse Horses in their 1st or 2nd year of showing, rider must be over 13, may be asked to canter.
- Lead line Ages 3-11 Walk may be asked to trot.
- No child will be tied or bound in any way to their horse. If they cannot hold
 on and ride independently they will be asked to leave the ring for their own
 safety.
- No one may approach the judge. The judge's decision is final. Please see the show manager for any questions.
- Water is available on the grounds, located near the horse pull area.
- All out of state horses must be accompanied by a current year negative Coggins and rabies certificate.
- No galloping on grounds. Any Walk Trot riders found cantering will forfeit their points.
- Proper show attire must be worn, shoes/boots with heels must be worn, no sneakers allowed.
- Dogs are not allowed on the fair grounds for safety reasons.
- There will be at least six ribbons awarded in each class.
- Championship Ribbons and Trophies will be awarded at the end of day.
- Any day-end ties will be broken by Showmanship and Barrels.
- Known kickers must wear a red ribbon in their tail.

- If classes are canceled due to weather fees will be returned for those classes only.
- The show committee reserves the right to cancel or combine classes.
- Please respect others and use sportsmanship at ALL times.
- Any display of un-sportsman like conduct and/or mistreatment of horses OR unruly horses in the arena or on the grounds will be asked to leave. No refunds will be given.
- Stallions must be shown by a person 18 and over and must have a yellow ribbon in their tail.
- Horses shown at the owners/riders risk. The show committee, DVFDA
 assumes no responsibility for damage to animals, riders, vehicles, and or
 articles brought to the show.


